6:30pm State of the Club presented by Ben Bailey, TAAA President

Introductory Presentation TAAA President Ben Bailey will describe the TAAA Mission and how the structure of the club is helping to meet it. Current activities, such as the Special Interest Groups (SIGs), School Star Parties, and other outreach efforts will be discussed. Club achievements for 2016, including the initiation of the Reynolds-Mitchell Observatory at CAC and the establishment of the Nominations and Volunteer Committee will be noted. Plans for 2017, such as the Fund Raising Campaign and its associated CAC development will be laid out. The session will end with a round table discussion in which all TAAA members can participate to share their views.

Invited Lecture 7:30pm A Night Watchman's Journey: My Life As A Searcher of Comets presented by David Levv: renowned speaker, writer, and comet hunter supreme

Popular speaker David Levy will recount his life as a comet hunter. In his words, "I began my search for comets on December 17, 1965, and I have been doing this work ever since, celebrating 50 years of hunting last December. It took me 19 years to find my first comet in 1984. Over the years I have discovered or co-discovered 23 comets. Probably my most important discovery was Comet Shoemaker-Levy 9 in 1993. This was the comet that crashed into Jupiter in 1994, becoming the first major solar system object to strike a planet since humanity began planet watching more than five thousand years ago. The event gave humanity a lesson in what happens when comets strike planets, and their role in the origin of life. Comet hunting has greatly changed since I started so long ago. With a little science, a little more poetry, and a lot of music, this talk will recount my story as a comet hunter.

The site includes concrete telescope pads with electricity, a roll-off roof observatory, a picnic ramada, and a full bathroom facility with shower room. At an elevation of 4800 feet, be prepared for cooler temperatures. Try to arrive before sunset. Our use permit limits the number of attendees at any one time, so reservations and cancellations are required. If you would like to attend, you must contact CAC Director John Kalas. Reservations are on a first come – first serve basis. You need to reserve for both nights if observing both nights.
