Introductory Presentation 6:30pm Seasonal Night Sky Objects

presented by Mary Turner, Ph.D.

Mary Turner, TAAA's appointed Chief Observer, takes us on a tour of the summer night sky. As usual in her popular talks, Mary's use of astronomical data, images, and mythology brings the seasonal changes in the sky to life.

Main Presentation 7:30pm Humanity's First Visit to a Star: The Parker Solar Probe

presented by Nicola Fox, Ph.D. Project Scientist, Parker Solar Probe The Dr. Nicola Fox, project scientist for NASA's Parker Solar Probe (via recorded Night Sky Network Webinar). Dr. Fox earned her Ph.D. in physics from the Imperial College of Science in London and is currently with Johns Hopkins University Applied Physics Laboratory.

In this timely video, Dr. Fox shares details about the upcoming mission to experience the solar atmosphere and provide humanity with its first ever close-up view of a star. Named for Dr. Eugene N. Parker, whose other contributions have transformed our knowledge of the Sun, the Parker Solar Probe will plunge through the Sun's atmosphere, facing brutal heat and radiation conditions to ultimately reveal scientists' first ringside research of the Sun's corona. Launch currently is scheduled for no sooner than August 4, 2018.

In spite of variable temperatures (one day the temperature ranged from 38' to 91'), rain, and some cloudy weather. Astronomers, of course, persevered and were as resourceful as possible, and we had great crowds of visitors.

Chiricahua Astronomy Complex (CAC) is the club's dark observing site, located in Cochise County approximately 100 miles southeast of the center of Tucson. The site includes concrete telescope pads with electricity, a roll-off roof observatory with a Celestron 14" telescope, a picnic Ramada, and a full bathroom facility with shower room. The new Reynolds-Mitchell Observatory includes a 40" telescope and a large warm room. At an elevation of 4800 feet, be prepared for cooler temperatures. Try to arrive before sunset. Our use permit limits the number of attendees at any one time, so reservations and cancellations are required. If you would like to attend, you must contact CAC Director Mike McDowell. Reservations are on a first come - first serve basis.
