CAC Star Party August 30 & 31 Dr. William Hartmann is a noted planetary scientist, artist, and writer. He received his B.S. in physics from Pennsylvania State University and his M.S. in geology and PhD in astronomy from the University of Arizona. He is Senior Scientist Emeritus at Planetary Science Institute in Tucson; the author of several books, including science text books, popular science nonfiction, and novels; and an artist with paintings displayed at the National Air & Space Museum. For this presentation, Dr. Hartman will focus on stories from his work during the Apollo years at UA's Lunar & Planetary Lab, as well as his current and future projects.

Dr. Hartmann will take us on a journey of exploration, presenting stories from his days as an amateur astronomer and later a grad student under Dr. Gerard Kuiper at UA's Lunar & Planetary Lab, and including his own discoveries and theories about the moon. He will also talk about his involvement in the origin of Mauna Kea Observatory in Hawaii in the '60s, his 30 years of experience on imaging teams for Mars orbiter missions, his development of a dating process for Solar System objects, and much more. This is sure to be a fascinating talk.

Chiricahua Astronomy Complex (CAC) is the club's dark observing site, located in Cochise County approximately 100 miles southeast of the center of Tucson. The site includes concrete telescope pads with electricity, a roll-off roof observatory with a Celestron 14" telescope, a picnic Ramada, and a full bathroom facility with shower room. The new Reynolds-Mitchell Observatory includes a 40" telescope and a large warm room. At an elevation of 4800 feet, be prepared for cooler temperatures. Try to arrive before sunset. Our use permit limits the number of attendees at any one time, so reservations and cancellations are required. If you would like to attend, you must contact CAC Director Mike McDowell. Reservations are on a first come – first serve basis. You need to reserve for both nights if observing both nights.

TAAA Policies for CAC & TIMPA Cont.

CAC Site Use

- TAAA members may use the CAC site 365 days of the year. However, access to the CAC site is by reservation ONLY.
- A security system has been installed at the CAC Site that makes it easier for members to access the site and it reduces the coordination effort of the CAC Director.
- It is required that all members notify the CAC Director via e-mail or phone to make a reservation to use the site; for both scheduled monthly club star parties and for private use. It is important for the club to know exactly who is on the site at any given time. This is for both club safety and liability requirements.
- Members should realize that although they may use the site with a reservation on nonevent dates, at such times, there will be no one present to assist them at the site.
- Familiarization with and appropriate adherence to Site Use policies will be necessary and required.

Telescope Use at CAC

- Club telescopes may only be used with the permission of the CAC Director or the acting site manager. There are several telescopes in storage containers available for member use.
- Only trained and certified individuals are permitted to operate observatory telescopes. The 40" and 9" telescopes in the Reynolds Mitchel Observatory (RMO) are dedicated for astronomy outreach and are not available for individual member use.
- The 14" in the Wallace Rogers Observatory (WRO) is available by reservation for WRO certified operators 365 days a year.
