The TAAA Board met on November 14, 2018. Some of the topics it addressed include:

- Ralph Means provided an inventory of and policies for the TAAA Equipment Loan Program located at TIMPA. The Board made a decision that while smaller scopes, in general, may be checked out and taken home. Certain telescopes may only be loaned on site at TIMPA or CAC. Also, loaners of telescopes need to be trained sufficiently to use the telescope they loan. Basic training can be part of the loan process.
- Doug Smith reported on the current status of and provided policies for the TAAA Library. An inventory is in process. Various books owned by TAAA have not been in the library and are currently being collected from storage locations. Â Each Book and library item is being reviewed to determine its best use
- Follow-up discussion was held regarding the suggestion from Gus Gomez to purchase TAAA labels for telescopes, and the labels have now been ordered.
